Note.--84c: If the territory of the proposed consolidated district contains fewer than 1,000 legal voters, the petition must contain the signatures of at-least twenty per cent of the legal voters. If it contains 1,000 or more, two hundred signatures will answer. Designating the school districts to be consolidated by number and by local name is describing the boundaries with sufficient particularity. The county superintendent must post the notices of election or authorize another to do so. In either case he should make a record of where and when the notices were posted, certified by himself and the one who did the posting. If the territory lies in more than one county, courtesy requires that the county superintendent...
